

GHOSTLY KITTEN GAMES



This is Marmalade, one of our three cats. He adopted us, but that's a long story. He's ginger and snow white with no black on him anywhere, so as soon as I saw the photo I knew it was strange.

I also think that I can see something else that may be interesting.



I cropped the photo so I could look more closely at Marmalade. He not only seems to be 'shifting' himself, he seems to have some invisible friends. There's a lot this cat hasn't told me! I can see some vague and misty spirit faces around him, but I'm not going to bother with them, because there's something else on the left side of the image between two shrubs. If you look closely you should be able to see the small whitish-colored apparition of a kitten. I'll crop that little apparition and return to it. First, I want to look more closely at my living adult cat.

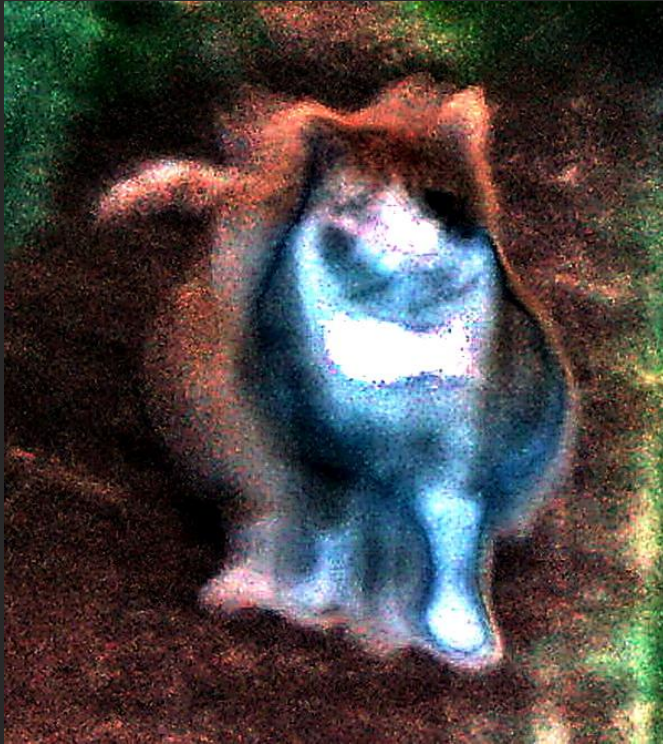


I'm honestly not sure any more if he was facing me or not when I took this shot. He was probably looking at me, as I was trying to get a photo of him and didn't notice any of the spirit activity at the time. His orange tail is visible on the left, but it shouldn't be in that position if the cat is facing me. Even if he was moving at the time I took the shot, it shouldn't look like this. It's almost as if he was stepping out of his body, and the black patches are strange, especially over his left eye.



A negative version, this demonstrates the strange transformation occurring around his head, especially on the left side.

It's as if he's in two dimensions at the same time, as one version of him looks solid and the other one more like a shadow in both the positive and negative versions of the image, but reversed.



Edited further and flipped back to positive, you can now see one of the spirits directly above the cat's head, although it's faint.



I cropped out the image of the ghostly kitten. It's crouched down in between two shrubs and looks a little like an illustration of a cat. The eye on the left contrasts visually sharply with the eye on the right. On the left (as viewed) it looks as though the cat's eye had been added with a pen, whereas on the right it looks more natural.

I've applied 'glowing edges' in a light pink color to this version, in case you had trouble seeing the kitten's face. This has highlighted its eyes and nose. I originally thought that the kitten had a lighter coloring across the lower part of its face, but it seemed formed with a very straight line so I decided to check it out.

Cropped, edited and sharpened I see something familiar. This is a cat collar. It's not exactly in the right place and it's a little large, but I think I understand.



The reason I recognize it is because I've seen these fabric collars for sale in dollar and department stores over the last few years. Perhaps you have also. It's hard to tell if the colors on the negative are accurate, but if so then the original collar would have been green or aqua and purple. I have a cat that loves his collar and is very upset if it has to come off for some reason. Perhaps in life this kitten associated its collar with having a home and being wanted. Whatever the reason, this kitten has chosen to retain this 'possession' after death. This is sad, but it seems he may have playmates. My own experiences and thousands of other peoples attest to the fact that animals also survive the mysterious change known as death, and that our animal companions also sometimes have invisible friends, as our children often do.
